E. Authorize Issuance of Bonds

Motion by Kathy Swezey, seconded by Margo Kibbler, that the following resolution be approved:

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF NOT EXCEEDING \$505,000 BONDS OF THE WINDSOR CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, BROOME COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF the ACQUISITION OF SCHOOL BUSES FOR SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the qualified voters of said Windsor Central School District, Broome County, New York, duly approved a proposition at the Special District Meeting of said School District duly called, held and conducted on December 13, 2016, authorizing the Board of Education of said School District to pay the cost of the acquisition of school buses, including incidental expenses in connection therewith as described therein, at the cost of a maximum estimated cost of \$505,000, and providing that said amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be levied by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said District to be collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the. Education Law, and to issue, in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize said class of objects or purposes and to provide for the financing thereof, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Board of Education of the Windsor Central School District, Broome County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The acquisition of school buses, including incidental expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized in and for the Windsor Central School District, Broome County, New York, at a maximum estimated cost of \$505,000.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes shall consist of the issuance of \$505,000 bonds of said School District, hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law. Such bonds are to be payable from amounts which shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property in said School District, and the faith and credit of said Windsor Central School District, Broome County,

New York, are hereby pledged for the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon. Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the Aforesaid class of objects or purposes is five years pursuant to subdivision 29 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 4.</u> Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said President of the Board of Education, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of such School District. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the President of the Board of Education shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 6.</u> The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said School District is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

<u>Section 7.</u> This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

<u>Section 8.</u> This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the official newspapers of said School District for such purpose, together with a notice of the School District Clerk substantially in the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.
