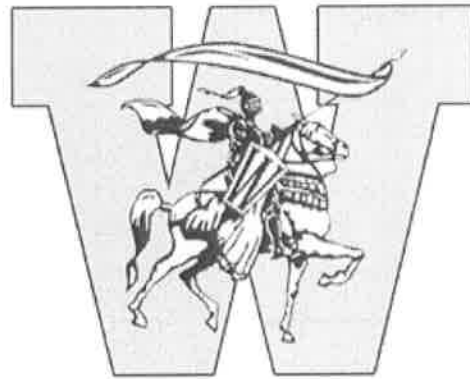

College Application Calendar

September

- Narrow down the list of potential colleges, make appointments and visit colleges.
- Look on Naviance for virtual college visits. Some are also still holding in-person visits.
- Find out what type of application your college accept (Common App, SUNY, etc)
- File the CSS Profile for Financial Aid, **if** it is required by your college.

October

- File the FASFA (and TAP if attending college in NYS) as early as October 1st
- 7th- Financial Aid Night via Zoom at 6pm
- 24th- ACT (Not at Windsor)
- Send SAT and/or ACT scores to colleges if you have not yet
- Check to see if you need to take a Subject Test
- Begin to prepare Early Action or Early Decision applications ASAP
- Ask teachers for letters of recommendation, in person and then invite them on Naviance.
- NCAA- If you plan to play Division I or II, make sure you have filed with the clearinghouse (ncaa.org)
- Visit college's Open Houses if you haven't visited them yet, check to see if they virtual or in person
- Visit college reps via zoom- check Naviance and our TV for announcements

November

- 7th- SAT (Not at Windsor)
- 1st or 15th- Typically Early Decision and Early Action deadlines for many colleges
- Complete and submit applications to all colleges before Thanksgiving break

December

- 5th (Not at Windsor)
- 12th (Not at Windsor)
- Check your emails *colleges will contact *you* if they're missing materials*

Jan.-Feb.

- Check and respond to any emails from your college(s) regarding financial aid

March-April

- Compare colleges' financial aid packages

May

- 1st- National deadline to respond to colleges (typically with required deposit for housing)

June-July

- Request college transcripts to be sent (e.g. if you took a class through SUNY Albany, you will need to request that Albany send your transcripts to wherever you are attending).
- Send AP Scores to colleges you are attending via collegeboard.org.
- Pack your bags and get ready for the next chapter in your life!

NEW YORK STATE RESIDENTS ONLY

What is it?

The State University of New York's Educational Opportunity Program provides access, academic support and financial aid to students who show promise for succeeding in college but who may not otherwise be offered admission. Available to first-time, full-time, matriculated students, the program supports students throughout their college careers within the University.

Support Services

Educational Opportunity Program students receive both academic and financial support. Academic support services may include: personal counseling, academic advisement, tutoring, skill development workshops, supplemental instruction and mentoring. As part of the student's overall financial aid package, the Educational Opportunity Program provides modest financial aid to alleviate non-tuition expenses (e.g., books, supplies, etc.).

Campus Participation

The Educational Opportunity Program is available at all SUNY campuses with the exception of: Empire State College, and Cayuga County, Clinton, Columbia-Greene, Corning, Herkimer County, Jamestown, North Country, Rockland, Sullivan County and Tompkins Cortland Community Colleges.

Fee Waiver

Students submitting applications for EOP consideration may qualify for application fee waivers for their first seven campus choices. If the applicant does not meet both academic and economic eligibility guidelines or, if the campus does not operate an Educational Opportunity Program, the student will be billed for the fee.

Who is eligible?

To be eligible for admission to the Educational Opportunity Program a student must: 1) be a New York State resident for 12 months prior to enrollment; 2) require alternate admissions consideration; and 3) qualify as economically disadvantaged according to the guidelines indicated. In selecting students for the program, priority is given to applicants from historically disadvantaged backgrounds. Admission is subject to program capacity.

To be eligible for the program as a transfer, a student must have been enrolled in the EOP, CD/SEEK, or HEOP program at his or her previous college. If the previous college did not have EOP or a similar program, the student may receive consideration for transfer eligibility and should notify the college to which he or she is transferring.

Academic Eligibility

Academic eligibility will vary by campus. To view the EOP freshman profile for each campus, visit www.suny.edu/eop-academics.

Financial Eligibility

The table to the right lists financial guidelines for Educational Opportunity Program eligibility. To be determined economically disadvantaged, a student's household income must not exceed the amount shown for its size, or the student's circumstances must conform to one of the exceptions indicated. Eligibility guidelines may be adjusted slightly each year.

NOTE: Applicants who are deemed ineligible for EOP may still qualify for admission and financial aid through other admissions processes.

Exceptions to Income Guidelines

- > The student's family is the recipient of Family Assistance or Safety Net payments through the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance; or through a county Department of Social Services; or Family Day Care payments through the New York State Office of Children and Family Assistance;
- > The student is in foster care as established by the court;
- > The student is a ward of the court or county.

What do you need to do on Naviance?

- Continue your college visits and join a scheduled zoom meeting for various colleges to talk to an admissions representative.
- Check out Scholarships.
- Add the colleges that you're planning on applying to in the *colleges I'm applying to* tab.
- Add the teachers that you're asking for recommendations from. *Do not do this until you ask them in person.*

Counselors will send all supporting documents to colleges via Naviance (transcripts, letters of recommendation, etc).

It is your responsibility to let your counselor know when your college deadlines are. Notify your counselor 10 days prior to your deadline to ensure all documents are sent successfully.
