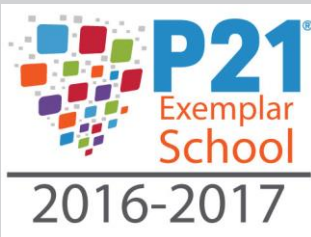

Dear Families

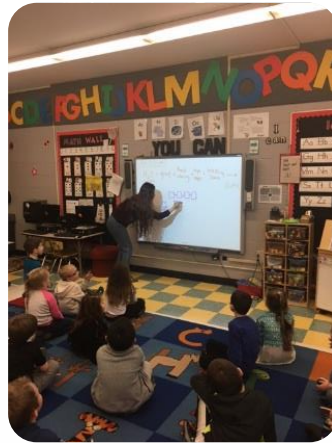
